Data security - take care when printing and photocopying If you're printing or photocopying on a shared printer, check you've left nothing behind before returning to your desk. Put a sign at the printer to remind colleagues to collect all their paperwork, including original copies. Collect your information immediately after pressing print on your computer so it isn't left unattended. When you print change the 'job type' to 'locked print' and add a pin number with the 'details' button so you're the only person that can collect the information from the printer and it won't just sit there for anyone to see.
